# Pyrus communis 'Bartlett'

## Bartlett Pear

Choose a location with lots of sunshine for blossom and fruit production. Sensitive to dry conditions and salt in the soil, they require moist, well-draining, and slightly acidic soils.

Bartlett pear trees will take about 2 years to establish and begin producing fruit. They've been known to continue producing fruit for over 100 years!

Favored for their sweet taste and fragrance as well as for canning because of the ability to hold it's shape and retain the sweet flavor. Also, great for baking pies.

## Prunus persica 'Georgia Belle'

### Bell of Georgia Peach

Great choice for espalier or trained against a wall, orchards, and anywhere you need a large, edible tree in the landscape.

The fruits are creamy-white with red cheeks, and the flesh is firm, white tinged with red. These peaches are perfect for eating, baking, and canning.

Happiest in full sun and moist, slightly acidic to neutral, well-drained soils.

## Rubus fruitcosas 'Big Daddy'

### Big Daddy Blackberry

-This is a popular thornless, mid-season variety known for producing very large, sweet berries. Its semi-erect canes do require trellising for support, but it is a relatively low-maintenance variety.

-The fruit from this variety is praised for its sweet taste with a hint of tartness. The berries can be eaten fresh, but they also hold up well when baked in pies and other desserts, as well as make excellent jams and other preserves.

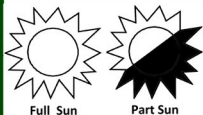
## Ficus carica 'Black Mission'

## Prunus salicina 'Burbank'

### Burbank Plum

The plums are red-purple with a yellow blush. The flesh is amber, firm, sweet, and very juicy. They ripen over a long season from mid to late summer and require several pickings. Perfect for eating, canning, or making jelly!

Performs best in full sun in loamy, mildly acidic to mildly alkaline, and well-drained soils. Typically takes 2-3 seasons to produce fruit and substantial crops usually start in the 4th season.

## **Carlos Muscadine Grape**

Find a location that offers full sun and moist, well-draining soil. Avoid shaded areas as fruit set/production will be reduced in the absence of sun during the growing season.

## Ficus carica

### Common Fig

Ornamental or fruit tree. The fruits can be eaten fresh off the tree, sliced for use in salads or with cheese spreads, dried, or used in pastries, preserves, and jams, among other uses.

Noted for its spreading habit, attractive foliage and edible fruit. Old trees with smooth silver-gray bark (sometime gnarled with age) are ornamentally attractive.

Best grown in organically rich, moist, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade.

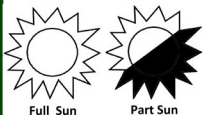

## Common Persimmon

Great to use as an ornamental landscape tree that produces an edible food crop.

Edible persimmon fruits (1-2" in diameter) mature in fall to an orange to reddish-purple color, and may persist on the tree into winter.

Easily grown in average, dry to medium, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade. Somewhat wide range of soil tolerance, but prefers moist, sandy soils.

## Rubus idaeus 'Crimson Night'

### Crimson Night Raspberry

-Fruit is conical in shape with a glossy deep-red appearance. Thick, sturdy canes grow vigorously, but need protection from winter elements. This is a self-pollinating variety, so you will get fruit from just one plant, but yields will be better with multiple.

-This variety is a fall-bearing everbearing variety. First berries will ripen in late June and continue through September.

## Rubus idaeus 'Fall Gold'

### Fall Gold Raspberry

An everbearing raspberry that grows upright, self-fruitful, and produces 2 crops on each cane in the late spring to early summer and again late summer to fall. The sweet raspberries are great fresh or for preserves and pies.

A full sun to part shade lover, this plant is best grown in organically rich, slightly acidic, moist, but well-drained soils.

Intolerant of wet soils which can cause root rot. When grown for harvest of its raspberry fruits, raised beds should be considered in areas with heavy clay soils.

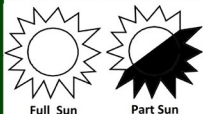

## **Fry Muscadine Grape**

A unique quality of the Fry muscadine is that it ripens from mid to late season over a prolong period of time of about 6 weeks.

A very vigorous vine with high fruit yields throughout the season and excellent heat and cold hardiness and resistance to diseases and drought.

Muscadine vines can grow in a wide range of soils. Highly fertile soils are not essential. Well-drained soils produce the best growth and yields. Avoid soils that are persistently wet during the growing season.

## Gala Apple

Big, shapely fruits have red-orange streaks over a golden background. Crisp white flesh has a delicious, tangy-sweet flavor. Ripens in September.

Soil type needed is average to loamy but it responds to enriched soil with better production. Apple trees do best with a slightly acidic soil pH.

Gala fruit production will respond best to full sun and air movement around the tree and through its branches.

This cultivar prefers well-draining and moist soil, so water it regularly, and don't let the soil dry. Choose a spot that gets 6 to 8 hours of sunlight during the spring and summer.

Mulch regularly to lock the moisture in the soil. When the tree matures, prune it periodically during dormancy.

## Jumbo Muscadine Grape

Prized for its abundant yields of nearly golf ball-size reddish black grapes. Excellent for fresh eating, jelly and juice.

Muscadine vines can grow in a wide range of soils. Highly fertile soils are not essential. Well-drained soils produce the best growth and yields. Avoid soils that are persistently wet during the growing season. The best and most muscadine berries will be produced when vines are growing in full to mostly sun. That said, muscadine vines that receive a little shade will still produce good crops.

### Kieffer Pear

Known for its high nut quality, high yield potential, early nut maturity, and excellent tree strength.

Pecan trees need water and sun in order to thrive. Be sure to plant in deep, moist, and well-drained soil. During the tree's first growing season, be sure to water regularly.

## Ficus carica 'L.S.U. Purple'

### LSU Purple Fig

This prolific fig tree bears three separate crops of figs each year – in early spring, summer, and fall!

Fruits are a rich shade of dark purple, sometimes with a reddish cast, and they hold another colorful surprise inside, strawberry-colored flesh.

Best in fertile, humus-rich, well-drained soil. Keep soil moist, watering freely in dry weather. Mulch annually to protect roots. Prune as needed to maintain size or shape.

### McIntosh Apple

## Prunus salicina 'Methley'

### Methley Japanese Plum

Landscape uses include edible gardens, alongside decks or patios, and specimen plantings.

The medium to large sized fruit has a purple to red skin. The flesh is red, tastes juicy and sweet. Great for eating fresh and making jelly. Ripens from late May to early June.

Best planted in rich, organically enhanced, well-drained soil, adding compost and manure to further enrich the site. You'll want to ensure the site doesn't pool water and create a soggy, stagnant environment.

## *Pyrus communis* 'Moonglow'

### Moonglow Pear

Grown primarily for the fruit crop, but early spring bloom has good ornamental value. This dwarf pear is ideal for landscapes with space limitations.

'Moonglow' is resistant to fireblight.

Best grown in well-drained humusy loams with medium moisture in full sun. More tolerant of heavy clays than many other types of fruit tree.

## Rubus idaeus 'Nantahala'

### Nantahala Raspberry

Consistent heavy yields of berries for eating fresh, canning, jams, jellies and pies.

Branches have fewer thorns than other varieties making berries easier to harvest. Red fruits are about the size of a quarter with excellent flavor and are a late season ripening variety.

Raspberries ripen in stages as the plants produce blooms and develop berries, it's best to harvest the ripe raspberries twice or more a week. Pick the darkest berries by hand. Ripe Raspberries will pull from the stems without crushing or tearing at the tops.

## Vaccinium ashei 'Powder Blue'

### Powder Blue Rabbiteye Blueberry

Heat tolerant and requiring fewer chill hours than other varieties, these blueberries vigorously grow in moderate to hot temperatures.

Drought tolerant but needs to be watered once a week during the first year. A good rule of thumb is to check the surrounding soil for dryness, about 2 or 3 inches down. If the soil is dry here, it's time to water your Powderblue.

## Vaccinium ashei 'Premier'

The fruits are wonderful eating right from the bush or used in desserts, pies, jellies

Delicate white blossoms bloom in spring, sprinkled across the vibrant, green foliage for an elegant, early season display. The foliage transitions to shades of orange and red for autumn.

Full sun and rich soil are necessary to grow a healthy blueberry plant. Soil should be high in organic content and have a 4.5 to 5.2 pH.

## Prime Ark Traveler Blackberry

-This thornless variety has a vigorous, upright growth habit that makes the berries easy to pick. Firm fruit holds up well making it perfect for eating fresh or using it in recipes. Taste is delightfully sweet.

-First-year canes begin ripening in July, while second-year canes bear heaviest crops in June, continuing to fruit until frost.

## Actinidia arguta 'Prolific'

### Prolific Hardy Kiwi

The vine produces a sweet fruit that's high in vitamin C and no larger than the size of a grape. The texture is smooth, so you don't have to peel it like fuzzy-skinned kiwis. The fruit is dark green on the inside and outside, and as it ripens, the skin will turn reddish.

This vine is ideal for planting on a trellis or fence. Flowers typically bloom by early summer and fruit arrives in the fall, and is more cold tolerant than other kiwi species.

# Prunus persica 'Red Haven'

## Red Haven Peach

The pink flowers bloom in mid-spring, reducing the risk of frosts. The large fruits have nearly smooth, orange to red skin and firm, sweet, flavorful, yellow flesh that does not cling tightly to the pit (freestone).

This cultivar is self-fertile, but may produce larger yields with another individual nearby.

Grow in average, medium moisture, well-drained soil in full sun. Self pollinating. Benefits from regular watering, fertilization and pruning.

## Punica granatum 'Salavatski'

### Salavatski Pomegranate

-This hardy fruit tree is known for its dependability and high-quality fruit. The large fruits have orange-red skin and red arils, and is self-fertile so you only need one to get fruits. Fruit is usually ready for harvest in late fall, and you'll know they're ripe when the skin turns deep red and feels heavy.

-Best to plant out of winter winds for extra protection and less exposure, especially for younger plants.

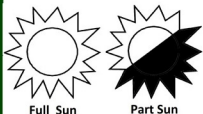
## Diospyros kaki 'Tanenashi'
